To work with marginalized, poor families facing multiple social, health, educational, and emotional problems, and to provide opportunities to move out of isolation, to socialization, to leadership in the local community, and to provide the opportunity to belong to "a family where everyone is called by name."

DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT

Please give a brief description of the Project:

PCD STAFF works with parents to keep young children up to age 3, devel opment al ^ on track through home visits and socialization groups. It also offers academic enrichment to children in grade 3 to K.

What is/was its main objective:

To support family life in positive growth, leading to development of full capacities of all members.

What is/were the main activities:

Parents and their children, ages 0-3 years, meet in groups of 10 for a morning or afternoon session, to participate in a variety of activities that include music and rhythm, interactive play, movement, art work, attachment, security and separation, language and literacy, exploration and learning, self - regulation and emotional development, connection to resources. These activities take place in LSAFHS Center, AS of the last few years, we have had 10 groups of 10 parents and child (ren) each enrolled. The other component is Home Visiting, 2x a month, the focus is strengthening the parent-child interaction and promoting healthy development. The main results of these activities is to help and support parents in a healthy development of their children in the early, formative years.
